

BANGLADESH - EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Bangladesh is a country on the Indian subcontinent. It is the most densely populated country in the world, as well as one of the poorest. In addition, it is very vulnerable to natural disasters, including floods and cyclones.

In 2014 it came 142nd out of 187 countries ranked in the United Nationals Development Programme report (UNDP).

In Bangladesh, almost half the adult population can neither read nor write. Fortunately, the new generation is better educated and the rate of illiteracy has decreased in recent years. However, there are still many in the slums and rural areas that get left behind.

The number of primary schools in rural and poor areas of large cities is generally insufficient to accommodate all children. As a result, enrolment in these areas is 20% below the national average.
