

SALVADOR – HEALTH PROGRAMME

Salvador is a country in Central America. Having endured a long period of civil war during the 1980s and 1990s, the country's economic and social conditions are improving only slowly.

In 2013, Salvador ranks 107th out of 187 countries listed in the United Nations Development Programme report (UNDP).

In Salvador, the infant death rate is three times higher than in Switzerland. Worse yet, the maternal death rate is more than 10 times higher than in Switzerland.

Maternal and infant mortality are especially devastating in rural and remote parts of the country. Medical infrastructure is limited in rural areas and the health care available is not good. It is estimated that more than 40 % of the population does not have access to adequate health services.
